The company will provide face masks and safety glasses which must be worn in addition to coveralls, gloves specific for the task being completed and safety footwear. No more than 3 persons are allowed inside a trailer or vehicle at a time and they must work apart from each other unless carrying out a task that requires more than one person. Additional PPE required for the task as described in manufacturing TBRA's is to be worn as prescribed on top of the mandatory PPE, such as cut resistant gloves, aprons or clothing.
